Downtowns faded with the allure of the suburban shopping malls and the national retail chains. In recent years, many communities have made an effort to reinvigorate their downtowns. Adrian is among the communities that is seeking to bring businesses to the storefronts that line their cityscape.

Local business owners have a unique opportunity to meet the needs of the community and to form relationships with the residents who become their customers.

After opening one store in North Adams,

Tammy Kies opened Tammy's Affordable Furniture, Antiques & More in Adrian. Kies had initially opened her Adrian location in the mall, but after having to leave the mall, a friend told her about an available building in downtown Adrian.

"I really like the people here. They wanted me to stay, and I wanted to stay," Kies said. Being a realtor as well as a business owner, Kies initially had concerns about the affordability of a space downtown. The pieces fell into place though, and Kies opened her downtown location a little more than a year ago.



Tammy's Affordable Furniture, Antiques & More sells name brand furniture by Ashley, Beauty Rest, and Sierra as well as other top brands. Kies enjoys being able to contribute to the local community through the store. "We offer financing programs through which people can both build credit and eventually, if they stay on schedule, own things. They get to have something nicer than a hand-me-down." Kies also helps the senior citizens in the community by providing free delivery for products like power lift chairs. Her store also sells antiques and collectibles sourced from local residents as well as from estate sales and other sources.

With a store that has the catchphrase "Let us


make your house a home," Adrian area residents are more than likely to find what they both need and want to furnish and enhance their houses and apartments right in their community.

Filling a void in Adrian also brought Gwynne Marks downtown. "We knew there was a need for a grocery store in downtown Adrian. It's actually considered a food desert," Marks said. Gwynne Marks, and her husband Jay Marks, initially intended to open The Marks Trading Company as a spice shop, but given the need and their vision, they applied for the Healthy Food Initiative grant in 2021, and they were awarded the grant. The Marks Trading Compa-

ny held their grand opening in September of 2022.

The store fills the need for fresh and wholesome food, particularly for residents who live in the downtown area who do not drive. Prior to the opening of The Marks Trading Company, the only options for food were a Dollar General, which lacked fresh and local options, and a Saturday farmer's market. Though the store does carry jams, jellies, pickled products, flours, pasta, sauces, and dressings, the store also offers residents locally sourced meats and fresh produce. "We partner with local farmers. All of the meat is local, and all of the produce is local in season." Marks noted that the store will supplement produce during the offseason, but she will return to sourcing locally as soon as the growing season in Michigan allows. Though Marks said that sourcing locally was initially difficult, due primarily to the size of their business, she has built a local network and is pleased with their progress. "I feel like it's a good community of farmers and vendors helping each other out," Marks said.

The store purchases products from local farmers and vendors on commission, a method that Marks describes as a "win-win" because the process allows the farmers and vendors to set their prices, and it frees up capitol that does not need to be tied up in inventory. With more of the funds from the grant, Marks plans to begin to carry dairy products and breads. Within the next few months, The Marks Trading Company will be a full grocery store. They will also feature a bulk foods section that will include nuts, flours, coffee, candy, and more. They offer customers the opportunity to purchase peanut butter ground in store. Similarly, customers can purchase oats milled on site.
